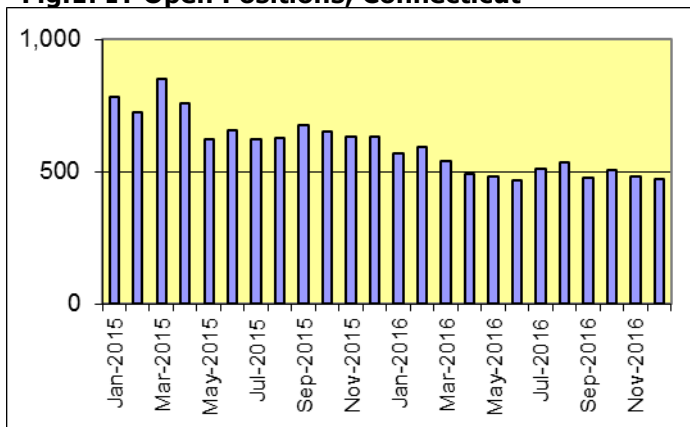
Welcome to the Connecticut IT job market in 2017. Labor demand for professionals in Information Technology remains at a low level. In December,

employers posted 470 job openings with job location in the State. This is 2.1% less than in November. While Connecticut tries to improve demand for IT labor through a variety of measures like technology startup hubs it is the large employers who could make a real difference in the short term. The question remains whether those companies with a substantial IT work force will increase their local technology footprint. The Connecticut Department of Labor reported that the two sectors with the largest IT engagement did not increase their payroll much in 2016. According to CT DOL, Financial Activities increased their payroll by 600 jobs and the Information Sector gained 100 jobs between January and November. Both numbers include non-IT jobs. These industries have scalable businesses models more than others with the opportunity to improve results by leveraging IT talent. Connecticut can do better!

**METHODOLOGY**

SkillPROOF surveys the inventories of job openings at large, regional and nationwide direct employers. Job openings are counted and verified every 24 hours. All data sources have been verified for timely removal of filled or closed positions. No data from job boards or search firms are included.

For this report SkillPROOF estimates the counts of job openings. Estimates are calculated directly from SkillPROOF's actual daily counts of job openings. As a base for its calculations, SkillPROOF uses data and findings from reports of the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) <http://www.bls.gov>.
